Dear Vice Chancellor Al-Noami:

This letter serves as formal notification and official record of action taken concerning the United Arab Emirates University (UAEU) by the WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC) at its meeting February 17-19, 2016. This action was taken after consideration of the report of the review team that conducted the first Seeking Accreditation Visit (SAV1) to UAEU November 10-12, 2015. The Commission also reviewed the institutional report and exhibits submitted by the school prior to the SAV1, and the institution's January 21, 2016 response to the team report. The Commission appreciated the opportunity to discuss the review with your colleague Provost Mohamed Albali. Your comments were very helpful in informing the Commission's deliberations.

Based on the team's report and the other information sources as identified above, the Commission has determined that UAEU is in substantial compliance with the four WSCUC Standards of Accreditation, thus making the institution eligible for Initial Accreditation effective February 19, 2016.

Actions

- 1. Receive the Seeking Accreditation Visit 1 team report
- 2. Grant Initial Accreditation for a period of six years
- 3. Schedule the reaffirmation review with the Offsite Review in spring 2021 and the Accreditation Visit in fall 2021.
- 4. Schedule the Mid-Cycle Review in spring 2019
- 5. Schedule a Special Visit in fall 2018 focused on the recommendations cited below.

Commendations:

The Commission endorses the commendations cited in the team report and especially commends UAEU for the following:

- 1. The commitment to educating Emiratis, especially females, to fulfill the aspirations of the citizenry and the nation. The Commission is aware that the team heard some concern on campus about the 'imbalance' in the overall numbers of male and female students at UAEU but supports the team's commendation, having determined that the success of the university in educating women in all fields is remarkable and deserves praise.
- 2. The culture of assessment of teaching and learning, as all course and program learning outcomes are aligned with institutional learning outcomes (ILOs).
- 3. The superb preparation for the WSCUC visit. The self-study was one of the very best the visiting team has ever seen, and the accreditation liaison officer and the WSCUC Steering Committee saw to every detail of the visit.
- 4. The commitment to WSCUC methodologies and processes and the institution's quick response to recommendations at every stage of the process.
- 5. The investment in the construction and design of state-of-the-art facilities, including classrooms, laboratories, and collaborative learning spaces. The physical campus is simply remarkable.
- 6. The initiative in establishing the Science and Innovation Park to promote innovation and research in the UAE.
- 7. The embrace by the university of a leading role in the future of the United Arab Emirates: as the nation's economy transitions from an oil-based to a knowledge-based economy, it will need a major research university. UAEU is positioning itself well in that regard.

Recommendations

The Commission has identified the following issues for further improvement.

- 1. That UAEU continue the evolution of board governance in keeping with best international practices, as advocated by such organizations as the *Association of Governing Boards* (AGB) (CFR 3.9).
- 2. That UAEU investigate, and to the extent possible, address the underlying conditions that are causing high faculty turnover, as it will need to retain talented faculty for longer periods than at present to continue its emergence as a research university (CFRs 3.1, 3.2, and 3.3).
- 3. While the team commends UAEU for doing so much to promote the development of Emirati into capable university staff, faculty and administrators, it is recommended that this policy be recognized as an appropriate form of affirmative action aligned with the government policy of 'emiratization,' and that this be openly acknowledged as a policy direction of the university (CFRs 1.6, 3.2).

- 4. That UAEU further develop the staffing, collections, services, and infrastructure of its Library, to better serve the needs of 21st century students and faculty (CFR 3.5).
- 5. That UAEU pay renewed attention to students' and graduates' proficiency in English. The Commission recognizes that any change in admission requirements will require a national conversation, both about admission requirements and about English teaching in pre-tertiary education. If such change is not forthcoming, UAEU will probably need to consider curricular changes to ensure that student proficiency in English is adequate for student success (CFRs 2.2a, 2.2b).
- 6. That UAEU consider the commitment of resources necessary to support the move to a more focused emphasis on graduate studies and research, and how this fits with its primary mission of undergraduate education. The Commission understands that this depends at least in part upon a national conversation, and it believes that UAEU has a role to play in that national conversation (CFRs 3.4, 3.5).

By granting Initial Accreditation, the Commission confirms that United Arab Emirates University has satisfactorily addressed the Core Commitments to Student Learning and Success; Quality and Improvement; and Institutional Integrity, Sustainability, and Accountability and is found to be in substantial compliance with WSCUC's 2103 Standards of Accreditation. Between this action and the time of the next review, the institution is expected to maintain its compliance with WSCUC Standards and uphold its commitment to continuous quality improvement.

Accreditation status is not granted retroactively. Institutions granted the status of accreditation must use the following statement if they wish to describe the status publicly:

United Arab Emirates University is accredited by the WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC), 985 Atlantic Avenue, Suite 100, Alameda, CA 94501, 510.748.9001.

The accredited status of a program should not be misrepresented. The accreditation granted by WSCUC refers to the quality of the institution as a whole. Because institutional accreditation does not imply specific accreditation of any particular program at the institution, statements such as "this program is accredited" or "this degree is accredited" are incorrect and misleading. The phrase "fully accredited" is also to be avoided, since no partial accreditation is possible.

The Commission stipulates that this action encompasses the degrees offered by UAEU at the time of this action, as listed at the end of this letter as the Consolidated List of Currently Offered Degrees. In keeping with the WSCUC Policy on Degree Level Approval, UAEU is designated as having an "I" (Individual) status for each of the degree levels currently being offered. This means that all new degree programs initiated by the institution will require prior approval through WSCUC's Substantive Change process. Degree programs that have been reviewed and included under this action may be extended to other currently approved campuses of the institution without

prior Substantive Change action. Offerings at new locations may need to go through Substantive Change approval, in accordance with the requirements stated in the Substantive Change manual.

In accordance with Commission policy, a copy of this letter will be sent to the chair of the UAEU governing board in one week. The Commission expects that the team report and this action letter will be widely disseminated throughout the institution to promote further engagement and improvement and to support the institution's response to the specific issues identified in these documents. The team report and the Commission's action letter will also be posted on the WSCUC website. If the institution wishes to respond to the Commission action on its own website, WSCUC will post a link to that response.

Finally, the Commission wishes to express its appreciation for the extensive work that UAEU undertook in preparing for and supporting this accreditation review. WSCUC is committed to an accreditation process that adds value to institutions while contributing to public accountability, and we thank you for your continued participation in this process.
