Abstract

The aim of this study is to highlight the method of appeal or appeal against judgments issued by the execution judge in accordance with UAE Civil Procedure Law. Where the executive judge in the UAE is characterized by the variety of actions that result from it: there are judicial acts in the form of judicial decisions issued in substantive disputes and temporary disputes, and the work of the state is in the form of a petition on a petition, and administrative work is the issuance of administrative decisions on the occasion of supervision of Implementation. We have used a set of references issued in the UAE Civil Procedure Code, forced enforcement and related Arabic references, as well as the judgments of the courts of cassation in the state. To study the subject from its various dimensions and aspects. The results of the study showed that each of these works has its own method of appeal or objection. In order to challenge the judgments issued by the enforcement judge in the substantive disputes, the general rules for challenging the ordinary provisions apply to them and the judgments issued in the temporary disputes It has the rules to challenge urgent judgments. As for state orders, the general principle of appeal is by way of appeal against a petition on a petition, except for the state orders specified by the law in article 222, and the appeal against it shall be appealed. Administrative decisions are not subject to appeal. However, if the decision concerns the interests of individuals and results in damage to the rights of the litigants, it may be challenged by way of appeal.
