Abstract

This study deals with the crime of trafficking in human organs in accordance with Federal Decree No. 5 of 2016 on the organization, transport and transplantation of human organs. In order to arrive at the problem of the study of the extent to which the federal legislator successfully criminalized the crime of trafficking in human organs in a manner commensurate with the international character of this crime. The study attempted to answer this problem by dividing the study into two chapters and a preliminary study, which dealt with the preliminary study on the history of the emergence of transplants and human organ transplantation and the legitimacy of human organ transplants and transplantation. In the first chapter, entitled "Trafficking in human organs", it dealt with the concept of trafficking in human organs and the philosophy of criminalization. The second chapter dealt with the substantive provisions of the crimes of trafficking in human organs and crimes arising from contravention of the rules on the transfer and transplantation of human organs and tissues.
