Abstract

The purpose of this study is to evaluate the efficiency of the federal guideline of the provisions and procedures of partnership contracts between government and the private sector, in respect of both objective and formal standards provided by the federal legislator to enter into partnership. This study presented the standards set out in the federal guideline in addition to the local law of Dubai, and those cited by comparative legislations such as French and Egyptian legislations as the first countries that adopted this system. Standards were analyzed in accordance with the above-mentioned guide and the comparison of legislations wherever the discrepancies were found, in order to move towards appropriate recommendations. The results of the study showed that the federal legislator has taken a similar course to the Egyptian legislator, but there were some dissimilarity with the French legislator as shown in the study.
