Abstract

This study deals with the subject of the penal order system in accordance with the laws in force in the United Arab Emirates compared to Egyptian law. The penal order system legislation in Egypt preceded the recent legislation adopted by the UAE legislation, making it more experienced in this field, especially since it has witnessed several amendments since its emergence in Egypt. Moreover, its jurists have also studied it and discussed some of its provisions. Therefore, we have decided to include the provisions of the Egyptian law and the opinion of jurisprudence on some issues so that we can develop the UAE law and make suggestions for this purpose. In addition, the study dealt with the legislative provisions of the penal order system. It also dealt with the original study of the idea of this system through its definition and the nature and similarities between it and some similar systems in achieving the purposes of punishment and the general rules of criminal law. We also tried to discuss the provisions of the penal order in two ways, the first being the extent of their agreement with the rules of criminal law and the second the extent to which they agreed with the purpose for which they were created. In the end, we reached conclusions and tried to present some propositions which we hope will contribute to the development of the legislation in force in the UAE regarding the penal order system.
