Abstract

This study deals with the issue of the penal conciliation system as a procedural system that aims to end the litigation by other than the criminal case in accordance with the laws in the United Arab Emirates compared with the Egyptian law.

Since the problem of the study revolves around the extent of the effectiveness of the conciliation system as an alternative settlement to the criminal lawsuit in ending the litigation, and the extent of the legislator's ability to balance between the desired goal of the conciliation system, which is to end the litigation and between achieving the purposes of punishment represented in achieving criminal justice, and achieving deterrence. We have decided to divide the research into three chapters.

In the first chapter, we discuss the nature of penal conciliation, and we compared between it and other similar system, to reinforce the knowledge about penal conciliation system. In the second chapter, we presented the procedural provisions of penal conciliation, in order to display the extent of the legislature's ability, through the required procedures and conditions to be followed , to achieve the effectiveness of this system.
