Abstract

The study raised the problems of the extent to which the Corona pandemic is considered a force majeure or an exceptional circumstance, as each adaptation has legal effects arising from it, so it necessitated research in the extent to which the conditions of force majeure or emergency conditions apply to the Corona pandemic (Covid 19) and its effects, and the research concluded that it is not possible. It is generally asserted that the Corona pandemic is an emergency circumstance or force majeure. Rather, it is necessary to research the impact of the Corona pandemic on the administrative contract, and then the adaptation is made based on the impact that occurred in the implementation of this contract, and it was also concluded that emergency conditions or force majeure only affect Continuous contracts whose execution is impeded by one of those circumstances or a certain force majeure event, as well as in spot contracts with deferred execution. This research has reached some conclusions and recommendations.
