Abstract

Electronic Monitoring is one of the latest issues listed by the Federal Scheme in the third chapter of the Penal Procedures Law, as this mechanism is based on utilization of modern technologies in the domain punitive implementation to reduce the disadvantages of punishment depriving freedom of pretrial detention.
