Abstract

One of the innovations in the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea for the year 1982 is the system of the exclusive economic zone, where it was discussed for the first time in this agreement. Maritime, but the legal system in the exclusive economic zone raises many problems that have been excluded from the negotiations of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea.
