Abstract

The thesis deals with the subject of child criminal protection against sexual exploitation crimes in the United Arab Emirates, as one of the new crimes that spread rapidly due to the technological progress, and development in the modern means of communication and the availability of speed and ease of spread in addition to the difficulty of follow-up and proof. The importance of this study is that it deals with a crime that affects children and their future, and has psychological, social and health effects that have been associated with them throughout their lives, thus threatening the family and the community alike, in addition These crimes are also carried out through the Internet, which making it easier to commit and conceal evidence, as well as the difficulty of tracking and arresting perpetrators.
