He is currently an External Examiner for the College of Medicine & Health Sciences, UAEU and Examiner for the Royal College of Physicians of London and the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh. He was previously Sub-Dean, School of Medicine, University of Sheffield, Academic Dean for South Asia, University of Sheffield, Professor of Medical Education & Head of Academic Unit of Medical Education, School of Medicine & Biomedical Sciences, University of Sheffield. He has extensive medical education experience in the UK and the Middle East in countries such as Iraq and Oman where he has been an External Examiner. Professor Bax has over 80 publications in areas including carcinoid disease, pharmacokinetics and medical education.
