Dr. Louis Hugo Francescutti Royal Alexandra Hospital and the Northeast Community Health Centre in Edmonton, Canada

Dr. Louis Hugo Francescutti is an emergency and preventive medicine physician, a university professor, an international speaker. He trained in preventive medicine at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore and is Past-President of the Canadian Medical Association, and Past-President of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, Dr. Francescutti has spent nearly three decades advocating one message: Live Smart. Reputed as one of Canada's leading medical visionaries and regarded internationally for his 'down to earth' and 'bold' methodologies, Lou is not intimidated by political correctness, nor is he afraid to tell it like it is. "People need to hear what the real issues are--no sugar coating. We live in a world that is far too complex and unforgiving. People need to learn that they are in control of their future and fortune--both in terms of health and happiness".

Dr. Robert Barrett has spent much of his life studying behavior, group dynamics, and organizational culture. His primary focus is on why we do the things we do and how individuals and teams can reach top performance. He has traveled to rural Nigeria to interview recruiters and leaders of death squads on how they indoctrinate fighters, he helped build Canada's first ever Patient Safety Officer program for Canadian hospitals, lectured on intercultural negotiation for senior Canadian Forces officers deploying to Afghanistan, and was lead researcher on a unique program designed to investigate ways to mitigate astronaut crew conflict in space for future Mars missions. Robert's work on motivation and team dynamics is also supported by 13 years as an elite athlete. Robert has written for the Huffington Post and has appeared more than 50 times on national television and radio. He is the recipient of a dozen major academic awards and is a human factors expert with over 15,000 hours of flying experience.

Prof. Martin McKee London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, UK

Prof. Martin McKee is Professor of European Public Health at LSHTM, London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine. He qualified in medicine in Northern Ireland and subsequently trained in public health in London. He manages a large research team studying the health effects of social, economic, and political transition. He has published over 1,200 papers in peer-reviewed journals, and he is author or editor of 46 books. He is in the top 1% of researchers by citations across all disciplines in the Clarviate world rankings.

His contributions to health policy in Europe have been recognized by election to Fellowship of the UK Academy of Medical Sciences, Foreign Associate Membership of Institute of Medicine of the US National Academies of Sciences, and membership of Academia Europaea. He has also been awarded 6 honorary doctorates. In 2003 he was awarded the Andrija Stampar medal by the Association of Schools of Public Health in European Region (ASPHER) and in 2005 he was made a Commander of the Order of the British Empire (CBE) for services to health care in Europe. Dr. Paichadze holds a Master of Public Health degree from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, where she also completed her postdoctoral fellowship and a medical degree from Tbilisi State University, Georgia.

Public health in the Arab World, are we doing well?



Prof. Iman Nuwayhid Faculty of Health Sciences, American University of Beirut, Lebanon



Prof. Salman Rawaf Imperial College London, UK

Prof. Iman Nuwayhid is a Professor of Public Health at the Faculty of Health Science (FHS) at the American University of Beirut (AUB), where he formerly served as Dean for 12 years (2008-2020). He received his MD from AUB and a Master of Public Health (MPH) and a DrPH in Occupational Health from The Johns Hopkins University, USA. Dr. Nuwayhid is American Board Certified in Occupational Medicine and an elected fellow to the Collegium Ramazzini since 2004. He is coeditor of the landmark book on "Public Health in the Arab World" (Cambridge University Press, 2012) and a co-chair of the Lancet-AUB Commission on Syria. Dr. Nuwayhid applies a social and political lens of analysis in his research, which focuses on the health of workers including working children, environment and health, and conflict and health. Under his leadership as Dean, FHS adopted a homegrown 360° system-network approach to public health teaching, research, practice, and policy, for which FHS received the "Global Health Leadership Award" in 2018 at the Arab Health Summit organized by the Arab Community Center for Economic and Social Services (ACCESS) in Washington, DC.

Prof. Salman Rawaf is the Chair of Public Health, Director of WHO Collaborating Centre in the Department of Primary Care and Public Health at Imperial College London, UK. He acquired his qualification in medicine, with training in pediatrics and public health, and spent the breadth of his career in leading roles in the NHS. Professor Rawaf is a globally recognized for his international work and contribution to global public health, health systems development, primary care and medical education in research and service delivery. He is an adviser to the World Health Organization on primary care, public health, health systems, medical education and training, human resource for health and COVID-19. He is involved in many national and international advisory works, including different task forces on COVID-19 and is a member of several editorial boards. Prof. Rawaf published almost 250 scientific papers, five books and many international reports and received many awards and recognitions including in 2015 a Life Achievement Award for innovative works in shaping health services, research and medical education



Public health genomics



Prof. Róza Ádány University of Debrecen, Hungary

Prof. Róza Ádány is a medical doctor specialized in preventive medicine and public health, founding Dean of the Faculty of Public Health, leader of the Public Health Research Group at the University of Debrecen, Hungary, visiting professor at the Semmelweis University (Budapest, Hungary). She is the immediate past president of the Public Health Genomics Section of the European Public Health Association (2012-2021), former President of the Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region (ASPHER, 2001-2003), Vice-Chair of the WHO European Advisory Committee on Health Research (2012-2020).

Her scientific research achieved international significance regarding the identification of susceptibility genomic biomarkers of cardio-metabolic diseases; investigation of the structure and causes of premature mortality in Europe, especially among Roma; and evaluation of interventions for improved efficiency of prevention. She has over 350 scientific publications and more than 8000 citations in the international literature. She received several prestigious international awards, such as Award of the European Regional Director of the WHO for outstanding contribution to the improvement of health of the European population (2019) and H.R. Leavell Award 2020 of the World Federation of Public Health Associations.



Genomics and translational epidemiology as drivers for public health

Prof. Vasilis Vasiliou (PhD), is Professor and Chair of the Department of Environmental Health Sciences. He received his BSc in Chemistry (1983) and PhD in Biochemical Pharmacology (1988) from the University of Ioannina, Greece. He then trained in gene-environment interactions, molecular toxicology and pharmacogenetics at the Department of Environmental Health in the College of Medicine at the University of Cincinnati (1991-1995). In July 2014, he joined the faculty of Yale University. In addition to his funded NIH-research portfolio, Prof. Vasiliou is the director of the NIAAA-funded R24-Resource Center for Mouse Models and Metabolomics Tools to Investigate Alcohol Metabolism and Tissue Injury. Prof. Vasiliou has published over 200 papers and edited three books on Alcohol and Cancer. Prof. Vasiliou is the editor of Human Genomics and serves on the editorial boards of several toxicology and visual sciences journals.


The global brain health survey

Currently she serves as Professor and Global Health Director at New York Medical College School of Health Sciences and Practice, USA. She currently serves as chair of the International Health Section of American Public Health Association. She is global health lead for the American Medical Women's Association (AMWA) and the NGO rep to United Nations. Dr. Murthy has been working with UN ambassadors and UN missions to promote women's health globally with local efforts. Some of the projects she has worked on include safe motherhood, spearheading the procurement of medical equipment to serve communities in Grenada, Kenya, India, Malawi, Liberia, and Nepal. She has worked with the former 1st Lady of Malawi on a Safe Motherhood Project by providing funds to establish maternity waiting home and supply safe motherhood kits to women.

During the COVID crisis in 2020/2021 Murthy has spearheaded efforts working with other NGOs, foundations in the US and other countries in sending Oxygen Concentrators to India and PPE (over 85,000,) masks, face shields to the Navajo Nation, local organizations, and individuals. She is currently working on a Menstrual Equity Project with the First Lady of Suriname.


